STEM WEEK 2026



Year 3 and 4

In year 3 and 4 during STEM week, the children looked at houses that can withstand a HURRICANE! They looked at how the houses are built!

The children talked about shapes of houses and how they could provide strength and safety when a natural disaster happened! They designed and then built their houses out of paper, straw and cardboard! "ALL the children loved building and designing their houses, they would 100% rate it 10/10" said Miss Humphries.

Year 5 and 6

In Year 5 and 6, we built eco-friendly houses focussing on insulation. We learned about what insulation is and where this goes in a house. We learnt that you can have double glazing in windows and curtains in front of a window. Extra floor boards and foam in your roof can also help. We then built houses, using cardboard and insulating materials (foil, cotton wool and bubble wrap) and tested them to see which house had the best insulation. To test this, we put an ice cube in a cup to see how long it took to melt. The slower it took to melt, the better the insulation. The fastest time was outside in 50 minutes and the slowest was 2 hours and 20 minutes. We took part in the LEGO workshop, building houses for the future. Some people built their houses on stilts and others added eco-friendly features such as solar panels.


About Cardiff castle!

World Book Day


